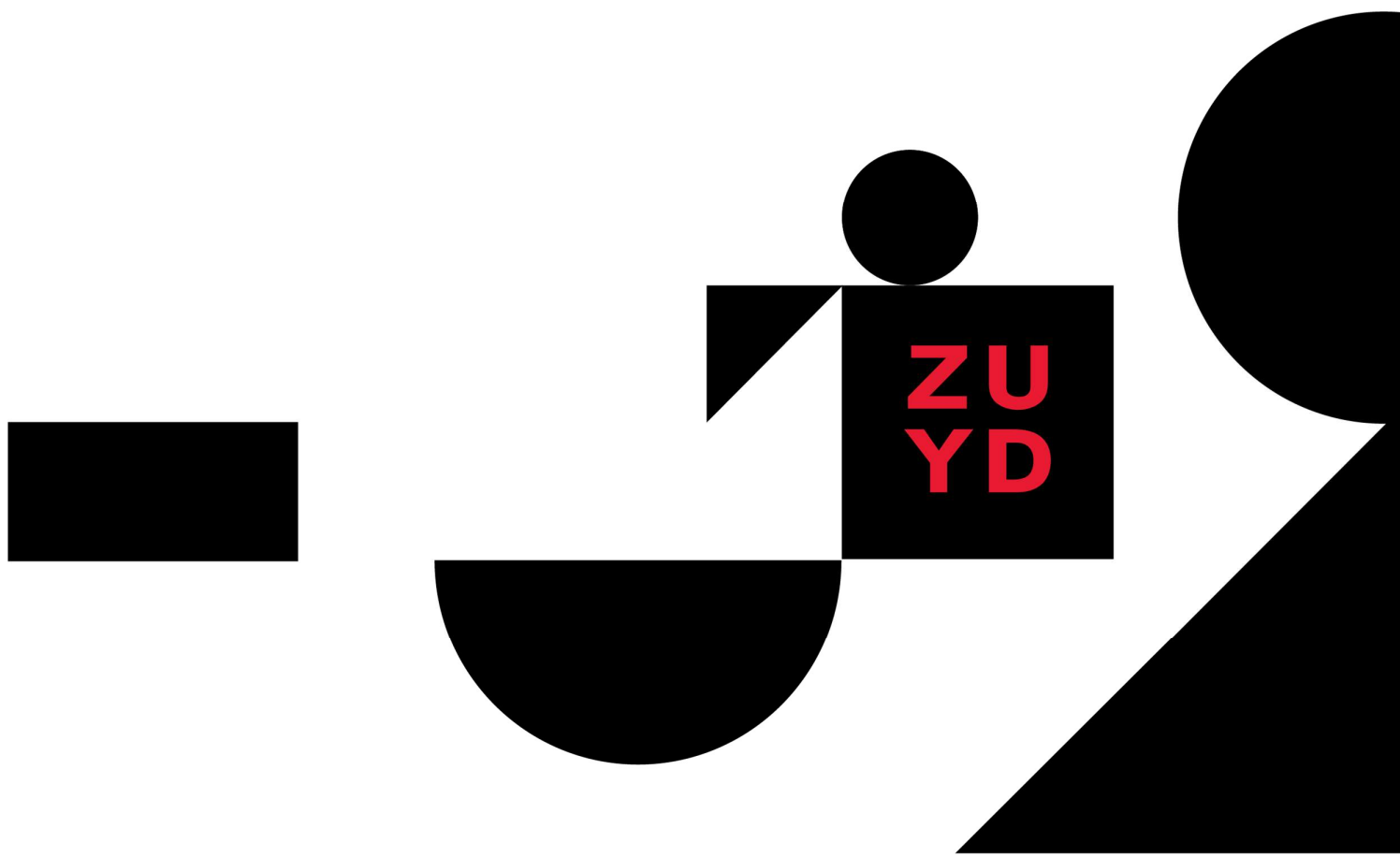

1. Statutory tuition fees for funded study programmes

Full-time study programmes

In 2026-2027, the statutory tuition fee for a funded full-time study programme will be €2,694. An exception to this is the full-time Hospitality Management programme, for which the fee will be €4,250. *The Higher Education (Quality in Diversity) Act (Wet kwaliteit in verscheidenheid) allows for tuition fee differentiation for study programmes designated as 'small-scale and intensive education' by the Accreditation Organisation of the Netherlands and Flanders (NVAO).*

Part-time study programmes

In 2026-2027, the statutory tuition fee for a funded part-time study programme will be €2,476.

Dual study programmes

In 2026-2027, the statutory tuition fee for a funded dual study programme will be €2,694.

2. Institutional tuition fees for funded study programmes

If you do not meet the conditions set out in Chapter 6, Article 6.1, paragraphs 1 and 2, of the Regulations on Admission, Enrolment and Deregistration, the institutional tuition fee will apply.

The institutional tuition fees for funded bachelor's programmes and master's programmes depend on the rate group a study programme is assigned to. The rate groups for 2026-2027 are as follows:

Low	€10,210
High	€12,280
Top	€13,940

We set the institutional tuition fees for funded programmes annually. For the 2026-2027 academic year, they have been indexed by 3.6% in line with the indexation of statutory tuition fees set by the Ministry of Education, Culture and Science. The categorisation of study programmes into rate groups is shown in the table on the following page.

The **Master Public Procurement** is a Joint Degree programme offered by Hanze University of Applied Science and The Hague University of Applied Science, Hanze

University of Applied Sciences acting as a coordinating institution. The institutional fee for the 2026-2027 academic year is € 10,528.

3. Institutional tuition fees for non-funded study programmes

We set the institutional tuition fees for non-funded programmes annually. The fees for the 2026-2027 academic year can be found below.

Full-time study programmes

The institutional tuition fees for non-funded full-time study programmes are as follows:

- a. €12,950 for the **Master's in Facility and Real Estate Management** study programme (abbreviated FREM); this tuition fee covers the full two-year duration of this programme. The tuition fee is inclusive of the fees payable to the University of Greenwich.
 1. The one-year programme is concluded with the final thesis. If the submitted final thesis is given a fail mark, the student will be entitled to improve the thesis and resubmit it within two months without being required to pay an additional tuition fee. If the resubmitted thesis is still given a fail mark, the student will be entitled to a third and fourth opportunity with the option to submit either a new thesis or another improved version of the original thesis. In both cases, the student will be required to pay an additional tuition fee of €3,000 for these resubmission opportunities.
 2. Students of the FREM master's programme can compete for a scholarship. Every student admitted to the FREM master's programme will receive an email through the programme with information and the description of the procedure for the FREM Master's 2026-2027 Scholarship. The ten best candidates will be awarded a scholarship, which will take the form of their tuition fees being reduced by €1,500.
 3. If a student deregisters from the FREM master's programme after 1 October of the year in which they started the programme, we will not grant a full or partial refund of the tuition fee. Students who leave the study programme between 1 September and 1 October of the year in which they started the programme will pay €2,800 to cover the fees payable to the University of Greenwich and the administrative costs. They will be refunded the remainder of the tuition fees already paid.
 4. Students who have already been enrolled in the FREM master's programme for two academic years and wish to enrol for a third or subsequent academic year will be required to pay a fee of €2,694 per academic year in accordance with the statutory tuition fee.
- b. €13,850 for the **Master's in Scientific Illustration**.

Part-time study programmes

The institutional tuition fees for non-funded part-time study programmes are as follows:

- a. €26,266 for the **Master's in Personal Leadership in Innovation and Change** (PLIC).
Due to its modular design, students follow most of the programme by enrolling as course participants. Those wishing to follow the Masterpiece Master Class must enrol as a student to enable their registration as a student in BRON-HO. There is a 10% discount for Zuyd alumni and employees. The breakdown of the costs is shown in the table below.

- b. €8,600 per year for the **Master's in Facility and Real Estate Management**.
 €8,300 for students who already started on the FREM master's programme in 2025-2026.

Tuition fees for the study programme cover the fees payable to the University of Greenwich.

- The final thesis is the final stage of the two-year programme. If the submitted final thesis is given a fail mark, the student will be entitled to improve the thesis and resubmit it within two months without being required to pay an additional tuition fee. If the resubmitted thesis is still given a fail mark, the student will be entitled to a third and fourth opportunity with the option to submit either a new thesis or another improved version of the original thesis. In both cases, the student will be required to pay an additional tuition fee of €3,000 for these resubmission opportunities.
- Students of the FREM master's programme can compete for a scholarship. Every student admitted to the FREM master's programme will receive an email through the programme with information and the description of the procedure for the FREM Master's 2026-2027 Scholarship. The 10 best candidates will be awarded a scholarship, which will take the form of their tuition fees being reduced by €1,500.
- If a student deregisters from the non-funded FREM master's after 1 October of the year in which they started the programme, we will not grant a full or partial refund of the tuition fee. Students who leave the study programme between 1 September and 1 October of the year in which they started the programme will pay €2,800 to cover the fees payable to the University of Greenwich and the administrative costs. Students will be refunded the remainder of the tuition fee already paid.

4. Students who have already been enrolled in the FREM master's for three academic years and wish to enrol for a fourth or subsequent academic year will be required to pay a fee of €2,694 per academic year in accordance with the statutory tuition fee.

4. Examination fees for external students¹

Full-time study programmes

The examination fee for external students enrolled in a full-time study programme is €2,694.

Part-time study programmes

The examination fee for external students enrolled in a part-time study programme is €2,476.

Dual study programmes

The examination fee for external students enrolled in a dual study programme is €2,694.

¹ **External student:** candidate taking only examinations, without participating in classes or supervision.
